When we think of church – and think of each other... what do we think? The Apostle Paul wrote the words shown on the opposite page.

Paul's thoughts for the church are ones of joy – not simply because they are nice group of people, but because of their partnership in the Gospel with him. Paul loves that together they are working for the Gospel. And he expresses his confidence that the Gospel work will continue because God will work through them. (v6)

I love how both those things fit together, all Christians are in Partnership with each other but also all Christians are in Partnership with God as he works through them. Together with God, we have a partnership that will enable the good work of God to be completed through us.

This little booklet outlines some of the ways we can express our partnership with one another.

Serve: Let us serve together for the sake of the Gospel, and the remainder of this booklet outlines all sorts of ways you could be involved

Give Financially: As we seek to be growing in Christ, loving his people and reaching Burford Benefice and beyond, we partner together in the financial costs of the entire ministry

Opportunities to Serve on Sunday Mornings

Hosting at a Sunday Morning Service

We used to call this Welcomers. It involves arriving about 30 mins before the service, giving a friendly welcome to our congregations and particularly looking out for and welcoming visitors and newcomers.

Hosting at the 7:00 pm Sunday evening meeting This is similar to the Sunday morning role but also involves to putting out and putting away the tables and chairs

Reading the lesson

Our readers are on rota which usually comes round about once a term. You are informed of the reading about a week in advance so there is plenty of time to prepare.

Leading the prayers during a service Those who lead our prayers during the service are also on a rota.

Prayer team after the service

After each service we provide an opportunity for specific prayer either for an issue that has been on their mind or something that may have arisen during the service.

Tea/Coffee team after the service

The teams who serve us tea and coffee after the service are made up of 3 or 4 people who do one Sunday a month. Team members arrive about 30 mins before the service starts to set up and then leave the service during the last hymn. This role also involves washing up afterwards so you are often the last people to leave the building at around 1:30pm

JAM and Rock Solid Team Roles

Every Sunday we have age-appropriate Bible lessons in small groups covering creche up to school year 9. We teach and discuss the Bible and think about how to live for Jesus in our everyday lives. We pray, have games and craft and have fun! Each group has both a leader and a helper.

JAM and Rock Solid Clear-up Team:

Pack away equipment and clear the rooms once the children have been picked up.

JAM Welcomer:

Welcome and help families as they arrive, guard the main door and help visiting families fill out contact form.

Opportunities to serve with Music

Music Group

The music group lead the sung worship at the 11am service and make use of a wide range of instruments, from the organ and keyboard to a variety of wind and string instruments, guitars and drums as well as singers. The group is made up of church members of all ages but who are usually of grade 5 standard or above on their instrument.

Choir

A four-part choir contributes to leading 9.30 Matins on the second Sunday monthly, singing an introit, and leading the congregation in singing psalms and canticles. Singers rehearse on Saturday mornings for an hour and a half, and for a shorter time just before the service.

AV/Tech team

For the 11 am service the tech team arrive about 10:30 to set up our microphones, cameras, screens and streaming arrangements. Full training will be given to anyone helping with this team.

Bell Ringing

We ring the bells for about 30 minutes before the 11 am service, and by request at weddings. Ringing practice is on a Tuesday evening. No prior experience is needed as full training is given.

Opportunities to serve during the week

Warwick Hall Reception

The Warwick Hall is a thriving hub used both by church and community groups as well as lot of visitors to our café. The reception is staffed entirely by volunteers who normally offer a morning or afternoon each week.

Welcoming visitors to the church

As a magnificent grade one listed building we get lots of visitors to our church. We try to keep the building open from 10 am until 4 pm everyday. Welcomers often offer to cover a 2 or 3 hour shift either on a regular or occasional basis. Visitors are often keen to chat and ask and this is often a great opportunity to great opportunity to share something of the gospel.

Flower Arranging

The flower arranging team work on a rota basis and usually create two large arrangements each week. Prior experience of flower arranging is preferred but help if always available.

Rock-a-Tots Team Roles

We serve our local community by running two back-to back singing and parachute groups for 0-3+ age. Every Tuesday morning from 9-11:30am.

Bakers: To provide tray bakes. 1 or 2 times a term. Helpers: To help host the morning with a small team. Occasional or weekly.

Coffee & Company

This group meets at 10:30 each week after our mid-week communion service either in the Church or, in colder months, in the Warwick Hall. Volunteers, make the tea and coffee, bake or serve cake and chat to the quests.

Signpost

Signpost runs each Wednesday from 10am-12pm in the Warwick Hall and is for anyone in our local community. It provides a confidential, listening ear and either appropriate practical help or signposting to professionals and organisations who can assist.

Time Out

Time Out is a social group for older people which meets every week on Mondays in the Warwick Hall. We start at 11 and finishing at about 3. Volunteers can be regular or occasional and help with setting up/clearing away, giving lifts to the less mobile, organising activities or befriending the members.

Specific events aimed for men or women We usually organise 2 or 3 events each year designed specifically for either men or women eg Men's breakfast or a Women's evening. Volunteers are always welcome to help set up, cook or be part of the organising team.

Event Hospitality

Similarly we also put on several events for the whole church family and their friends. Events might include a barn dance, a day out, harvest supper, a quiz night or even a weekend away. Help is always welcome both with planning and organising the events.

Small groups

Small groups are one of the best ways of growing together in our faith. A small group makes it easier to get to know people in the church family. A typical evening will include talking over coffee, discussing a Bible passage together, and praying for each other. Group members seek to encourage and support one another in living the Christian life week by week.

Parochial Church Council (PCC)

The PCC are the trustees and the leadership group of the church. It meets every two months and members typically serve for 3 years. Elections occur each year at our AGM. There are also several sub committees including, Finance, Fabric, Management, Mission Support and Evangelism. Sub-committees are made up of a combination of PCC members and volunteers with a particular interest or experience in that area.
